1970 - 2020

1970 - An Archery Club was formed in Cardiff with some financial help from Cardiff City Council.

This club was later to be named Castle Bowmen, after being given permission to practice inside the walls of Cardiff Castle on the Castle Green. Due to the fact that a number of the original members were employed at City hall.

- 1984 Castle Bowmen Archer Denise Davis wins the British Championships
- 1985 Castle Bowmen teams entered for the South Glamorgan Postal League
- 1986 Arrow Straightener purchased for the club members to use
- 1987 Enamelled club badges introduced for Club Members
- 1991 Fund raising by the club for the British Olympic Team
- 1991- A talk was given to Castle Bowmen members about Field Archery "The Club Members did not respond well to this talk" extract from Castle Bowmen official AGM minutes 1991
- 1993 Despite still having permission to use Cardiff Castle Green Sunday Mornings 10-12 if they wish. Castle Bowmen officially cease links with Cardiff Castle due to no storage space for equipment and difficulties in parking and peacocks whilst shooting. Letter sent to Cardiff City Council thanking them for its use over the years.
- 1993 Arthur Knighton donates Shield trophy to club to be awarded annually to any member that makes an Outstanding contribution to the club in coaching or shooting
- 1995 Castle Bowmen win Team Trophy at Gwent Outdoor County Championships
- 1995 25 year Anniversary. Club members have a celebratory meal.
- 1995 Castle Bowmen win Team Trophy at Glamorgan Outdoor County Championships
- 1996 Fire at Heath Park Hall destroys 20 Castle Bowmen Bosses and stands
- 1998 Enamelled Medals introduced for awarding at Castle Bowmen Tournaments

- 1998 Former Chairman Doug Woodley dies.
- 1999- Castle Bowmen Mid-Summer tournament renamed the Doug Woodley Shoot in his Honour
- 2000 Glamorgan Junior Indoor Championships hosted by Castle Bowmen
- 2002 Three new bosses purchased for club costing £288.60 in total
- 2003 Glamorgan Junior Indoor Championships hosted by Castle Bowmen
- 2003 Castle Bowmen member Mike Woodfield becomes the last archer to hold the title of South Wales Champion, as the South Wales Archery Society is finally disbanded after being merged with North Wales Archery Society forming the Welsh Archery Association a few years earlier
- 2005 Heath Park Hall closed down and demolished Club Indoor Shooting relocated to St Davids College, Pen y Lan
- 2005 Glamorgan Junior Indoor Championships hosted by Castle Bowmen
- 2005 Castle Bowmen win Team Trophy at Gwent County Championships
- 2006 Archery GB (formally GNAS) change tournament dress regulations to allow clubs to have their own club colours. Castle Bowmen club colours officially registered as Dark Blue and Club Apparel is now available to members.
- 2006 Arthur Knighton gives approval for The Arthur Knighton Award criteria to be amended to include Outstanding contributions to the running of the club.
- 2006 Castle Bowmen Member Andy Ellis qualifies as a GNAS Judge
- 2007 Castle Bowmen host the Glamorgan County Senior Indoor Championships for the first time (and have done every year since)
- 2007 Castle Bowmen donate trophy for the Recurve team prize at the Glamorgan indoor Championships - which they then win back
- 2008 Council builds new footpath on Castle Bowmen field and causes havoc with Easter Shoot competitor numbers
- 2008 Extra evening of indoor shooting Castle Bowmen members started at Llandaff City Bowmen's indoor range
- 2009 Castle Bowmen run the first Olympic style Head to Head tournament in Wales
- 2009- Castle Bowmen member Glenn Bell #1 in Welsh Rankings for Gent Recurve

- 2010 Commonwealth team members compete at Castle Bowmen's Easter Shoot
- 2010- Castle Bowmen member Wendy Woodfield #1 in Welsh Rankings for Lady Barebow
- 2011 Started Bow hire scheme to help new members until they get their own
- 2011 Castle Bowmen archers are in the winning Glamorgan County team at the Welsh Archery Association Inter-County Tournament
- 2011 Glamorgan Junior Indoor Championships hosted by Castle Bowmen
- 2011 Castle Bowmen has 5 qualified coaches
- 2011- Castle Bowmen member Matt Gray #1 in Welsh Rankings for Gent Recurve
- 2012 Castle Bowmen Member Val Goodman was voted in as Glamorgan County Chairman
- 2012- Castle Bowmen member Chris Mearns is #1 in Welsh Rankings for Gent Barebow
- 2012 Castle Bowmen Junior Club officially established
- 2012 Introduced the first annual club Team Head-to-Head handicap tournament in Wales
- 2013 Introduced the Only Annual (12 Dozen round) Junior Only tournament in Wales
- 2013 Castle Bowmen archers are in the winning Glamorgan County team at the Welsh Archery Association Inter-County Tournament - Team Manager for that year was Glenn Bell from Castle Bowmen
- 2013 New larger design tournament medals were introduced for the club
- 2013 Indoor Classification badges introduced for club members
- 2014 Castle Bowmen archers are in the winning Glamorgan County team at the Welsh Archery Association Inter-County Tournament - Team Manager for that year was Chris Means from Castle Bowmen
- 2014 Olympic Archer Larry Godfrey shoots at Castle Bowmen's Winter Tournament
- 2014 Complimentary Club member badges introduced for new members

2018 - 9 Castle Bowmen in the County team for the WAA inter-county shoot.

2018 - New Castle Bowmen flags designed and ordered for the club

2019 - #1 Lady (Kathy Counsell) AND #1 Gent (Mike Woodfield) Barebow in Wales

2019 - Castle Bowmen Member Mike Woodfield voted in as Glamorgan County Chairman and Steve Chamberlain as Glamorgan County Secretary.

2019 - Castle Bowmen Barebow Team Ranked #1 in the UK

2020 - Castle Bowmen hold the Indoor County Championships for the 14th consecutive year.

2020 - 50th Anniversary of Castle Bowmen. Special 50th Anniversary enamelled Club badges presented to ALL club members. 50th Anniversary Tournament held.

Castle Bowmen has the largest club in South Wales based on member numbers.

Members have shot for the Welsh team and Glamorgan County team on multiple occasions.

Castle Bowmen members held numerous Welsh and County records.
